Regarding the University Response to the COVID-19 Situation (Consolidated Version #2)

As newspapers, television and other news outlets have been reporting for several days, the COVID-19 infection has been running rampant, not just domestically, but all over the world. In light of the spread of the infection, as well as the emergency declarations by the municipal governments in Hyogo Prefecture and Osaka Prefecture, universities have been asked to suspend their operations as well.

The thing we can all do in this situation is to remain at home and avoid going outside as much as possible. As no effective medical treatment has currently been established, it is necessary to reduce opportunities for person-to-person contact as much as we can. This is the optimal way to protect your health and safety, as well as that of your friends and family.

Our university values on-campus learning, including extracurricular education, where faculty members and students gather and learn together. We had moved forward with making preparations in order to offer a wide range of subjects this year, as well. In this social climate, however, in order to prevent our campuses from becoming infection clusters, we believe that it would be difficult for us to conduct classes as usual, and so we have decided to take the following measures. Previously made announcements have been included in this notice, as well. Please attend classes after checking the information.

We realize that this is inconvenient, but this decision was made with your health and safety as our top priority. We ask for your understanding and cooperation. We sincerely hope that we will soon be able to resume our regular lives and see you all in person, with smiles on our faces.

Undergraduate and Graduate Classes (Except for Classes at the Institute for Business and Accounting and the Law School)

We have conducted classes since April 21, starting with those classes where preparations for online lessons are complete. As for the form of those online lessons, assignments, summary listings, video broadcasts and other course content will vary from teacher to teacher. There are also classes which will begin in earnest after May 7, when preparations for online lessons are complete.

Syllabi will undergo revision so that classes may more appropriately meet their course objectives as online classes. Confirm the syllabi of classes you are going to take (information about the content of online classes will be listed in fields such as "Course Format" and "Study Required Outside Class").

We realize that there are many aspects regarding online classes which may worry you, such as making preparations before taking the classes, as well as how to access and operate each system. However, university staff will do their best to provide support that is easy to understand as possible, and exercise utmost consideration, so please do your best to approach online learning in a positive manner.

Class-related announcements will be posted in the notices section on the Kyogaku Web Service, so please check it regularly. Be aware that emails from teachers will be sent through LUNA to students' university email addresses (@kwansei.ac.jp). [Updated] Ban on Entry to Campus Premises

We will extend the ban on entry to campus premises which was in place up to May 6 (Wednesday), until May 31 (Sunday). [New] Tuition Payments and Applications for Taking a Leave of Absence

The deadline for making tuition payments has been extended by one month, from May 19 to June 19. There is also a system at the university for deferring tuition payments. If you are unable to pay tuition by the deadline, please contact your affiliated school or graduate school.

The submission deadline for requesting a leave of absence has been extended from May 7 to May 29. If you would like to request a leave of absence, please contact the office of your affiliated school or graduate school during the above period.

[New] Financial Support Such as Scholarships

(1) Special Scholarships

Kwansei Gakuin University will provide special scholarships to support students whose household financial situations have suddenly undergone major changes, and who are having difficulty paying tuition. The scholarship amount shall be limited to either 400,000 yen (the annual amount) or the equivalent of half the amount of tuition (rounded down to the nearest thousand yen), whichever is lower. We will make an announcement on the website when details are finalized.

(2) HECS-Type Loans

Kwansei Gakuin University will set up HECS-type loans for students who are having financial difficulties due to reduced income from part-time jobs, etc., as a result of COVID-19. The amount of the loan will be over 30,000 yen, with the equivalent of annual tuition fees (roughly 700,000 to 1,200,000 yen) as the upper limit. Repayment will be deferred until the income of the student after graduation exceeds 400,000 yen. We will make an announcement on the website when details are finalized regarding procedures, etc.

HECS-Type Grants: A deferred tuition payment program implemented in Australia.

(3) National Study Support System for Higher Education

You are eligible for the national study support system if it is confirmed that you fulfill the conditions because of a sudden change to your household financial situation, and your income prospects after that change, due to COVID-19. Please read the following for details. [MEXT Website]
